Cookie and SDK Notice

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This Cookie and SDK Notice explains how LOOT uses cookies, local storage, mobile SDK storage, device identifiers, and similar technologies.

1. What Technologies We Use

We may use: browser cookies; local storage and session storage; mobile app storage; SDK identifiers; device and app identifiers; pixel tags or similar web technologies; and server logs and request identifiers.

2. Why We Use Them

Strictly Necessary

Sign-in, session maintenance, account security, fraud prevention, consent choices, request routing, and core product features.

Preferences

Remembering settings such as selected workspace, app preferences, filters, and display choices.

Analytics and Performance

Understanding usage, diagnosing bugs, improving speed, measuring feature adoption, and improving product quality.

Security and Fraud Prevention

Detecting abuse, rate limiting, investigating suspicious activity, and protecting wallets, accounts, campaigns, and payouts.

Marketing

Used only where enabled to measure campaigns, understand referral sources, or provide marketing communications. Non-essential marketing cookies are not activated in jurisdictions requiring consent until required consent controls are in place.

3. Third-Party Providers

LOOT may use third-party providers for authentication, wallet infrastructure, hosting, content delivery, database, analytics, monitoring, email, support, and fraud prevention. These providers may use their own cookies, SDKs, or identifiers

when needed to provide their services.

4. Your Choices

You may be able to control cookies through your browser and device settings. Blocking some cookies or storage may prevent LOOT from working properly. Where required by law, LOOT will not intentionally activate non-essential analytics or marketing technologies until required consent controls are in place or consent has been obtained.

5. Mobile App Storage

The mobile app may use secure storage, local app storage, SDK storage, and device permissions for login, API sessions, media uploads, wallet status, notifications, image/video selection, and app diagnostics.
